The Dallas Study Club Mission Statement:

To provide a team learning environment that promotes an exchange of knowledge to advance the level of diagnosis and treatment provided to our patients.

I. Introduction to Seattle Study Club and Dallas Study Club

The Seattle Study Club is a network of dental study clubs started by Dr. Michael Cohen in the early 1990s. Currently, there are over 250 Affiliate Clubs in the United States, Canada and Australia, all dedicated to bringing the finest in continuing dental education to clinicians in their local communities. While each club is run by its own Director(s), they all follow the Seattle Study Club model, and adhere to the underlying goals and tenets of the organization.

Once a year, the members and Directors of these Affiliate Clubs are invited to the Seattle Study Club National Symposium. This multi-day educational extravaganza features presentations by top clinicians from around the world, as well as treatment planning workshops and seminars designed to enhance personal and practice growth. It draws approximately 900 people, of which about 450 are dentists practicing all over the United States, Canada and Australia. The National Symposium is the biggest educational event that the Seattle Study Club sponsors, and it is the brainchild of Dr. Michael Cohen. Dr. Cohen's ideas for the yearly meeting are implemented by the Seattle Study Club staff, a team of individuals whose job descriptions are distinct, yet whose duties often overlap.

The Dallas study club was established in 2009 and has quickly become one of the largest and most progressive Study Clubs in the country. It has also started several sister programs for Implant Study as well as advanced implant studies in immediate hybrid therapy.

II. Our Goals

The goals of the Seattle Study Club are to promote and advance the following.

- A. Interdisciplinary treatment planning as the foundation of ideal, comprehensive care for patients in the United States, Canada & Australia.
- B. Peer-based, ongoing learning in the context of the Seattle Study Club model as the most efficient and effective way for dentists in the field to enhance their understanding of basic and advanced techniques and technologies, and to improve their ability to treatment plan and treat complex cases in the interdisciplinary setting.
- C. Commitment on the part of dentists to achieving their full professional potential in becoming “complete clinicians” — those who are able to marry the science and the art of dentistry to deliver the highest and most beneficial level of care to their patients.
- D. Enthusiasm and passion in dentists for the profession of dentistry, and a true understanding of the immense benefits dentistry can provide to patients seeking improvements in their health and beauty.
- E. Professional camaraderie and the sharing of knowledge between and among dentists and the development of a professional and personal support network within the context of the study club.
- F. A “university without walls” inside the Seattle Study Club, such that clinicians have ready access to leading dental authorities in a variety of fields, through their presentations at local Seattle Study Club meetings, their articles and cases published in the Seattle Study Club Journal, their participation in Seattle Study Club web sessions and their lectures and workshops at the yearly Seattle Study Club National Symposium.

“Breathing Disordered Sleep”

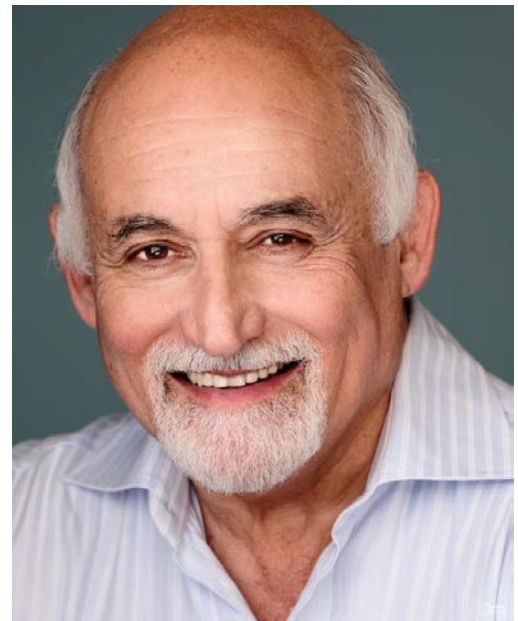

Since becoming involved with the Dental and Orthodontic professions some 20 years ago, and by default the “Sleep Dentistry” component, Roger Price has directed his total focus towards developing programs which recognize that the vast majority of so-called “Sleep Disorders” are primarily “Breathing Disorders” which become aggravated during the various processes and stages of sleep.

He created the concept of “breathing disordered sleep” to explain this phenomenon and to highlight the fact that using the well-worn term ‘sleep disordered breathing actually places the focus in the wrong area.

If the focus is on “sleep” that is where the solution will be sought, and the only options are CPAP, Oral Appliances or Surgery. None of these address the origin of the problem. His approach is to address daytime function/dysfunction in order to lessen the night time load on the body, and to prevent the onset of the sleep disruption.

He causes raised eyebrows with his statement that “Dentists do not make Sleep Appliances”. He explains that in reality, “Dentists make Breathing Appliances” yet have no training in this area. He has been the driving force behind the standardization of teaching, training and protocols in the ancillary fields of myofunctional therapy and breathing retraining - both of which have their origins in dysfunctional behavior patterns created over time - resulting in symptoms and deficits. This has resulted in the emergence of a University based, Academically Certified qualification in both fields. Roger Price is a much sought after speaker, both locally as well as internationally and is the recipient of the International Functionality Association Lifetime Award for his contribution to Form and Function.

Jeffrey S. Rouse, D.D.S. maintains a private practice in San Antonio, Texas and practices with Drs. Gregg Kinzer and Frank Spear in Seattle, Washington. He is also an Adjunct Assistant Professor in the Department of Prosthodontics at the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio and a Resident Faculty member at the Spear Education Center in Scottsdale, Arizona. After graduation from dental school in San Antonio, Dr Rouse completed a 2-year General Practice Residency at the University of Connecticut Health Science Center. He practiced family dentistry for twelve years before returning to school. Dr Rouse received his specialty



certificate in Prosthodontics from the University of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio in 2004. He is a member of the American Academy of Restorative Dentistry, the American College of Prosthodontists, and past president of the Southwest Academy of Restorative Dentistry.

Dr. Rouse has written numerous journal articles including a portion of the “Annual Review of Selected Dental Literature” published each summer in the *Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry*. He has a textbook published in 2016 by Quintessence titled *“Global” Diagnosis: A New Vision of Dental Diagnosis and Treatment Planning* written with his teaching partner, Dr. Bill Robbins. Furthermore, he has contributed chapters on porcelain veneers and anterior ceramic crowns to three editions of a dental textbook. Dr. Rouse lectures nationally and internationally on a wide variety of topics ranging from dental esthetics to airway prosthodontics.

Hal Menchel has been treating TMD patients in his practice in Coral Springs Florida since 1985, limiting his practice to orofacial pain since 2002. He received his training under Drs. Henry Gremillion and Parker Mahan at the University of Florida Facial Pain Center in the 1990's.

He passed the rigorous requirements for Diplomate of the American Board of Orofacial Pain (one of only 300 in the world) in 2000. Dr. Menchel has been honored as a fellow of the American Academy of Orofacial Pain for his contributions to the field with publications in peer reviewed Journals, including JADA, his efforts in National Access to Care for Orofacial Pain, and his teaching. He serves as an officer in the Academy.

He is the AMA liaison for insurance coding for orofacial pain, and is a reviewer for the Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry.

Dr. Menchel lectures internationally to both dentists and physicians. He is on faculty in the Prosthodontics department at NSU dental school, and has appointments at Larkin Hospital in Miami, and University of Miami Medical School.

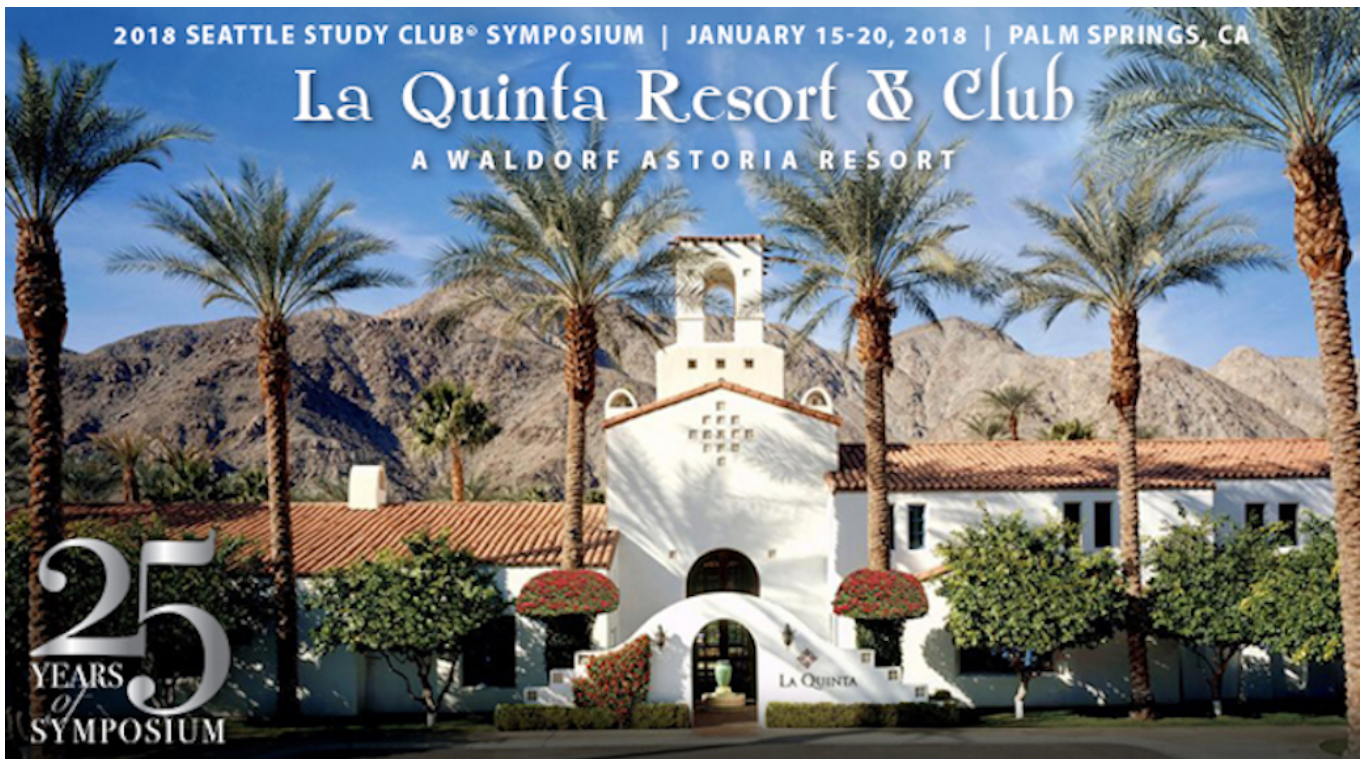
